The NM Children's Foundation's (NMCF) mission is to provide funding to small community-based nonprofit programs designed to foster the physical, emotional, educational, and social development of New Mexico children and their families.

Since 1992, NMCF, founded by New Mexico First Lady Alice King, has granted over \$2 million to 256 nonprofit organizations in all 33 counties of New Mexico. Eighty-eight percent of all monies raised by NMCF are used for grants.

What kinds of children's programs and activities does NMCF support?

We fund after-school and summer camp programs, literacy, language and STEM learning, access to grief, depression and LGBTQ counseling, school clothing, health and food programs, parenting support, and cultural education.

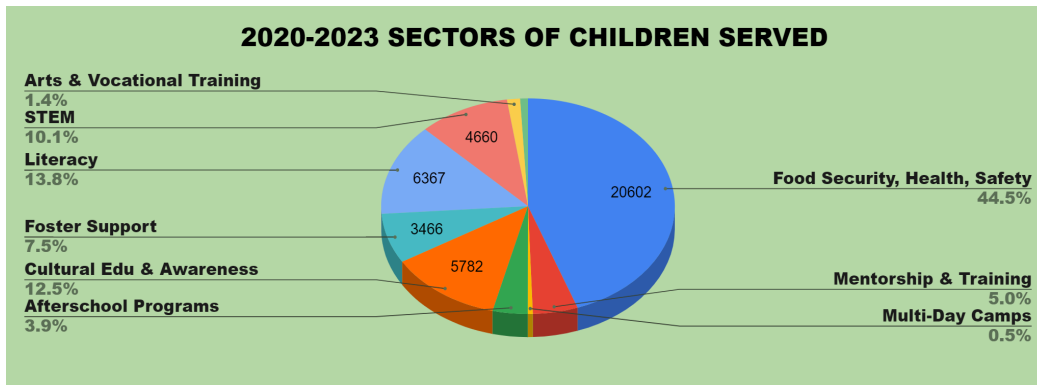
